State Policies Addressing Child Abuse and Neglect

Defining child abuse and neglect is an important first step in developing preventive policy solutions Child maltreatment is often broken up into two distinct categories—abuse and neglect Child abuse and neglect often occur in combination Child abuse is intentional or deliberate acts of harm, or threats of harm, committed against a child

specifically, the primary federal law is the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA) 2 CAPTA was first enacted in 1974, and has been reauthorized and amended many times since 3 CAPTA requires states to implement specified federal policies in exchange for federal funding for child abuse and neglect programs

1974 as an acknowledgment of the problem of child abuse and neglect, and to provide federal financial support and policy direction to address it The act has been reauthorized and amended many times in the past 40 years The CAPTA Reauthorization Act of 2010 extended the law through the end of FY 2015,9 and Congress has continued to fund
