Qualitative Research Proposal Sample

Research Perspective A qualitative research approach is proposed for this study The theoretical perspective most often associated with qualitative researchers is phenomenology (Bogdan & Biklen, 2004) Following the phenomenological approach, researchers seek to understand meaning in events and in human interactions

Thinking about the Coding Process in Qualitative Data Analysis

Coding is a ubiquitous part of the qualitative research process, but it is often under-considered in research methods training and literature This article explores a number of questions about the coding process which are often raised by beginning researchers, in the light of the recommendations of methods
