Mendelssohn, like other Romantic composers, wrote programme music One of his most popular examples is his Midsummer Night's Dream This is music written for a play by the famous playwright, William Shakespeare He wrote the Wedding March - the music sometimes used to announce the new bride and groom FELIX MENDELSSOHN 1809 - 1847

Romantic Era: 1800-1900, or nineteenth-century music aesthetic: freedom from boundaries, including those that separate the arts: music becomes more programmatic, merging with literature, art, and philosophy; programmatic elements reflect this trend;

The Four Main Musical Style Periods

- Fortepiano - the early piano was much smaller than today's 88-keyed monster, therefore classical music has a much more limited range than Romantic and Modern music
- Many pianos did not have pedals - those that did were typically operated by the knee (which was more difficult to use) Therefore most classical music uses very little
