The winner-take-all factor means that any votes won by the loser of the popular vote are not reflected in the electoral vote For example, in 2008, Barack Obama won only 51 percent of the popular vote in Ohio Still, he won all of Ohio’s 20 electoral votes, even though 25 million Ohioans voted
